Smart tax-day money moves

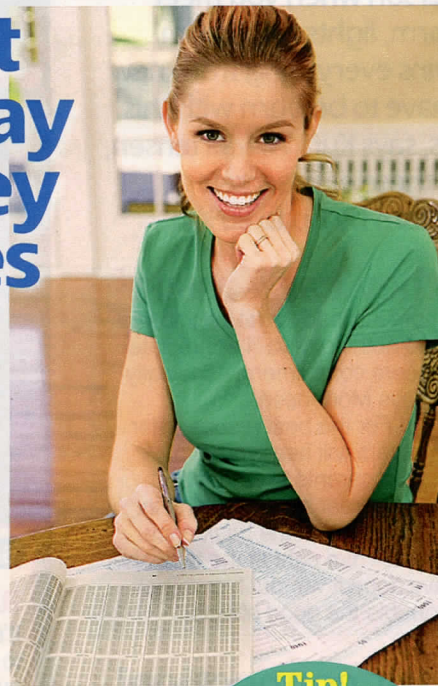
Whether you're waiting for your refund or still need to file, we've got the tips to make this your most stress-free tax day ever!

● Check the status of your refund!

Waiting for your refund to, say, make a big purchase or pay off a credit card? To find out when you can expect that check, visit www.irs.gov and click on "Where's My Refund?" or call 800-829-1954 for automated refund information. You'll need the primary Social Security number on your return, your filing status (single, married filing jointly, etc.) and the exact amount you're expecting.

● **Enjoy a free extension!** Not able to file by April 15? Not to worry! This year, taxes aren't technically due until April 18. The reason? April 15 falls on a holiday observed in Washington, D.C., so everyone's tax deadline gets pushed back under federal regulations! To file fast, try an online tool like TurboTax (TurboTax.com) or H&R Block At Home (TaxCut.com). You can pay as little as \$20 and be done in as little as two hours or less!

● **Get more back in 2012!** If you ended up owing or think your refund was too skimpy, fatten next year's refund now by adjusting the amount you pay in. Just use the IRS's online Withholding Calculator to figure out the correct filing status and number of allowances, then adjust your withholding by filling out a new Form W-4 with your company's personnel office.



Tip!

Got an e-mail from the IRS? Don't open it! The IRS never sends e-mails to taxpayers, so it's likely from scammers who are trying to steal your private information.

Credit card security alert!

Got a credit card embedded with a radio frequency identification technology (RFID) chip? The high-tech plastic makes it easy to pay just by waving your card in front of a scanner. Trouble also makes it easy for thieves to hold of your debit and credit cards without ever laying a hand on your wallet! All they need is a special scanner to steal the private info being emitted from the RFID chip. The good news: Specially lined wallets that block scammers from picking up RFID signals are now available. One to try: Travelon RFID Blocking Ladies Wallet, \$14.95, Amazon.com.



Slash your electric bill!

The secret to trimming your electric bill? Look around for competing utility companies! Many towns have more than one electric supplier, and their prices can differ by as much as 20%! To find all the suppliers in your area, log on to WhiteFence.com, plug in your address and click "electricity." Then zero in on the "per kWh" (price per kilowatt hour) column, which reveals the cheapest option.



Don't throw that away!

Turn a bottle cap into a pretty Easter egg stand!

Eggs all decorated for Easter? Show them off by turning ordinary plastic caps from soda, milk and juice bottles into colorful—and sturdy—egg stands! Just save the tops from empty containers, then glue a piece of decorative ribbon around the outside of the cap and allow to dry. Turn it upside down and rest the egg on top for a pretty—and free—display!
