Avoid the latest scams!

Just when you thought you'd heard them all, crooks have cooked up new versions of old schemes in an attempt to steal your money. Luckily, you can avoid being one of their victims by knowing the signs to look out for!



Old scam Phony job-placement companies ask you for a fee in advance even though all costs are paid by companies seeking new employees.

New scam Instead of a fee, scammers now request your Social Security number, bank information and other personal data, or ask you to fill out a credit check form with all your personal info so they can steal your identity and take cash straight from your bank!

● **Protect yourself:** You never need to share such data or provide info for a credit check until after you accept a job—and then do it only in person.

Old scam Hackers break into an e-mail account of someone you know and send fake e-mails claiming they're in distress and need money wired to them immediately.

New scam Hackers are doing their homework by reading e-mails and researching their victims on Facebook. And they're using that information to target people who are more likely to fall for the fake plea.

● **Protect yourself:** No matter how real an e-mail seems, always double-check its authenticity by calling the person directly.

Old scam Con artists call to say you won a lottery, but you have to wire cash to pay for fees and taxes first before claiming the prize.

New scam Since Western Union got wind of this fraud, crooks now use a different tactic: After they tell you that you won a lottery, they convince you to purchase a pre-paid debit card to pay them the taxes and fees you owe on your prize!

● **Protect yourself:** Keep in mind that legitimate sweepstakes never ask you to pay fees or taxes to accept a prize.

Looking to rent a house or apartment?

Scammers are now posting fake ads, then concocting stories to get you to rent the home without seeing it in person! Stay safe by always meeting the owner in person, and make sure they have a key that opens the door.

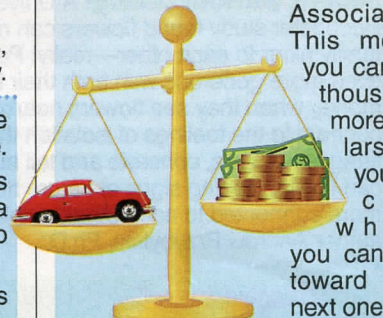
Surprise: Fast food makes you spend!

Strange as it sounds, passing fast-food restaurants—such as McDonald's and Taco Bell—on the way to a store makes you more prone to splurge, according to a recent University of Toronto study. The reason: Most folks associate fast food with rushing, so simply seeing the restaurant or even a logo automatically speeds you up and makes you less likely to spend time searching for the best deal.
